



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

#### Les Yper Yper | 6–9 July

Coming from around the world (Lebanon, Jordan, Portugal, Israel, France, Germany, Switzerland, Hungary, China, South Korea) 13 Type Master students at ECAL, University of Art and Design of Lausanne, attempted to design Greek typefaces for the first time. Switzerland, being their point of connection, allowed them to start and grow their journey of understanding and expressing a new script. They overcame the challenges by understanding the aesthetical history of Greek typefaces and the calligraphic notions. Based on their own background and experiences, they interpreted their own contemporary approach to designing a Greek typeface and had different ways of not understanding the script, pushing their designs in dissimilar directions.

Η ανεκτικότητα σε κάθε τι διαφορετικό, σε άλλες σκέψεις ή απόψεις, επιτρέπει τη δημιουργική προσέννιση και την πρόοδο σε ατομικό και συλλονικό επίπεδο. Αποτελεί προϋπόθεση για μια κοινωνία απαλλαγμένη από τον φανατισμό, τη μισαλλοδοξία, το ρατσισμό, τον εθνικισμό και κάθε είδους διακρίσεις και κοινωνικές ανισότητες. Ταυτόχρονα, είναι ο θεμέλιος λίθος για την καλλιέργεια του αλληλοσεβασμού και της αλληλεγγύης, της συνεργασίας και της συναίνεσης καθώς και το αντίδοτο στην περιθωριοποίηση και τον κοινωνικό αποκλεισμό.

#### Printing Shop Asterios Ch. Goussios | 8 July

In 2003, 'cmyk' (Christos Goussios) presented the audiovisual project Druckmaschinnemusik [https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yl9BSr1ITXM], where the sounds of printing machinery coexisted and interacted with musical sounds. This project represented the Municipality of Thessaloniki at the 11th Biennale of Young Artists of Europe and the Mediterranean, which was held in Athens in 2003. Since then, it was presented a couple of times live in Thessaloniki, with pre-recorded machine sounds.

In July 2022, and on the occasion of 20 years of the International Conference on Typography and Visual Communication (ICTVC), the Druckmaschinenmusik will be performed live at the printing shop of Asterios Goussios, in Oraiokastro, Thessaloniki.

At the event, which will be organised in the framework of the 8th ICTVC, the audience will have the opportunity to participate in a unique audiovisual experience; a live performance by 'The Prefabricated Quartet' and other quest musicians interacting with the

sounds of the actual printing machines in situ.

## Hot Metal / Cold Pixels: Experimental letterpress printing in the 21st century

Printing Shop Asterios Ch. Goussios Jeff Pulaski, Richard Kegler | USA 9.30–17.00 Tuesday 5 & Wednesday 6 July

This two-day hands-on workshop is open to any skill level, from novice to experienced printer. Participants will take home individual prints as well as a collaborative group project. Working within the historic printing museum/workshop of Asterios Ch. Goussios, historic materials will be integrated with new contemporary tools to produce immediate relief prints under the guidance of Jeff Pulaski and Richard Kegler.

A life-long Kansan, Jeff Pulaski was born and raised in Newton, Kansas in the United States. He is currently the Director of the School of Art, Design and Creative Industries at Wichita State University. His letterpress collection includes various platen and cylinder presses, a Prouty Power Press newspaper press, an 18" Challenge paper cutter, a Model 31 Linotype and large assortment of metal and wooden type.

Richard Kegler formed P22 Type Foundry in 1994 and after starting the Book Arts Center in Buffalo, New York, became the director of the Wells College Book Arts Center in Aurora, NY. Richard has spent his career combining an interest in traditional printing crafts with entrepreneaurial initiatives. His current project Dry Inc. focuses on predigital printing and typography and new printing tool development.



In search of a new Greek ampersand / "και" Workshop

#### In search of a new Greek ampersand / "και"

PΩ Art Space **George Triantafyllakos** | GREECE 10.00–13.30 Wednesday 6 July

Since the end of the 15th century, typesetters and printers employed a large and extremely diverse variety of ligatures to represent the Greek ampersand "και". This complex collection of strange characters and shapes has been gradually forgotten and a simple kappa (κ) looking character has taken their place. Although this character has its own position in the unicode table and can be found in some (not many, though) contemporary typefaces, its use has been limited and it is continually decreasing. The aim of the workshop is to discuss whether there is a need for a new universally accepted design of the Greek ampersand..

George Triantafyllakos holds a PhD in Participatory Design of Educational Software from the Computer Science Department, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece. He received his BSc from the same Department. In September 2015 he started the Atypical type foundry. He has designed typefaces for the Greek Font Society. In 2017 he participated in the team of designers that won the competition for the design of the new visual identity of the National Library of Greece (George D. Matthiopoulos, Dimitris Papazoglou, George Triantafyllakos and Axel Peemöller). The same year he was a member of the jury committee of the Greek Graphic Design and Illustration Awards (EBFE 2017). In October 2019 he was awarded at the 11th GRANSHAN Type Design Competition for the design of the Dolce Noir type family.


